


The DEFINITE ARTICLE

The way you want to be remembered... Quietly, by those who love me.

20-20 vision. I'm 57 and I've always had great eyesight. I only needed


+1 lenses for reading until I had laser surgery last year. It's actually made my sight worse – the world's a blur now and I've been told it may take six months for the treatment to work properly.
