The pet hate that makes your hackles rise... Rice left on plates that blocks the dishwasher! It's happened three times recently and I have an idea who's responsible...

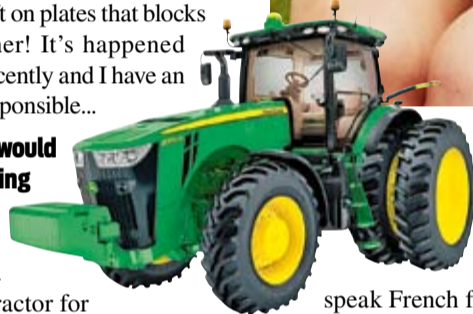
The crime you would commit knowing you could get away with it... I'd steal a

The unfulfilled ambition that continues to haunt you... To finish my first children's novel. An entire draft is done, but I'm struggling to find the motivation to do the rewrites that will make it better.

The priority activity if you were the Invisible Woman for a day... I'd spend the day with a leopard and her cubs, watching her hunt.

The poem that touches your soul... WB Yeats's He Wishes For The Cloths Of Heaven, which I first read in my 20s. It's about respecting the dreams of others.

The misapprehension about yourself you wish you could erase... That I'm really together. Some of our friends call us the 'Turbo Logans' because they think I'm so in control, but I'm not at all slick. I'm constantly juggling to stop everything from crashing down.

The event that altered the course of your life and character... My brother Daniel's sudden death [in 1992, aged 15, from the heart condition hypertrophic cardiomyopathy]. It was devastating and changed everything for my family and I forever.

The way you would spend your fantasy 24 hours, with no travel restrictions... I'd wake up on an idyllic island in the Indian Ocean with all the family and have a breakfast of exotic fruit, eggs and coffee by the beach. Then we'd go on a long bike ride in the Swiss Alps and ski

for hours at Grindelwald in the shadow of the Eiger mountain. We'd have lunch – fresh fish, salad and vegetables – at the Eden Rock hotel on St Barts in the Caribbean. Afterwards I'd swim in a lake in Vermont, then we'd head to Los Angeles because the kids love it there. We'd have a Japanese dinner of wagyu beef, sushi and tempura with a glass or two of sauvignon blanc. The day would end on a cold wintry night at home in Buckinghamshire.

The happiest moment you will cherish forever... Waking up after an emergency blood transfusion when I lost half my blood giving birth to the twins. Finally being with them was blissful.

The saddest time that shook your world... Nothing has ever come close to the shock of Daniel's death. It still brings so much sadness because new landmarks come and go. He would have turned 40 this year.

The philosophy that underpins your life... Do your best and just keep going.

The order of service at your funeral... I want a big garden party with plenty of wine and music and I want people to wear bright colours and be happy.

The way you want to be remembered... She always had a spring in her step.

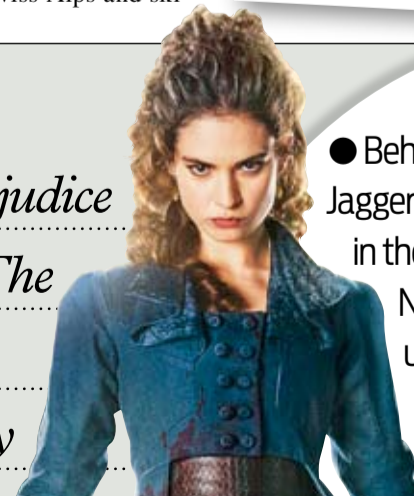
